- Read Exodus 3:6. Why is Moses's action of hiding his face an act of awe and worship?
- Read Isaiah 53:3. In what ways did people hide their faces from the crucified Christ? In what ways was this surprising?



Relax with a cup of coffee or tea and write a list of the things you're hiding in your life. This may be difficult at first. Pray and ask God to help you trust Him with these things.
